We have been so amazed at how the preps have settled in to school and been able to follow our daily routines. Each student has been giving every task their best effort with a great amount of enthusiasm.

In Reading, we are currently focusing on learning to identify letters and the sounds that they make, while also finding those letters within books we are reading. We are beginning to learn how to blend the sounds together that we have learnt, to read words. We are also learning about features of books and how to care for our shared library.

In Writing, we have been learning how to correctly hold our pencil and trace our name. During our Writing lessons, students have been identifying the starting point and what direction to write letters.

In Numeracy, we are currently focusing on identifying numbers from 0 to 10 and are representing them using different materials. We have been learning how to write numbers correctly and match with collections.

Our school value of Respect has been a focus throughout our Integrated Studies lessons, where students have identified what it means to be respectful and how to show respect in the classroom and in the yard.

The Prep teachers are so proud of every Prep student for their incredible start to school! Keep up the amazing work!

Also, all of the students are loving the new playground!


















# Japanese Term 1

# Japanese Learning

All students in Grades 1-6 have made a positive start to Japanese! In the first two weeks of term, students had warm up sessions by participating in Japanese classroom routines, learning basic Japanese culture and making a front cover for their Japanese workbook. Students were introduced to five classroom instructions in Japanese and they responded to them through actions.

In our Japanese lessons, students will develop a positive attitude towards learning Japanese by engaging in a variety of games and tasks.

They will also:

- Learn how to say their name in Japanese (full sentence)
- Learn how to greet each other in Japanese
- Learn how to say body parts in Japanese (junior classes only)
- Learn how to say what they like/don't like in Japanese (Senior classes only)
- Create a speech showing how to introduce themselves in Japanese (Senior classes only)

We are looking forward to a wonderful term of Japanese learning.
