On Wednesday our Year 3 and 5 students started NAPLAN. Over the next nine days, students will be completing online NAPLAN assessments in the areas of Writing, Reading, Conventions of



Language (spelling, grammar and punctuation) and Numeracy. A NAPLAN individual student report will be provided to parents of Year 3 and 5 students later in the year. The school will also receive data to assist with future planning.



Performing Arts Term 1

All students have begun the year in Performing Arts with music-making, through singing, listening and playing some of the school's growing collection of beautiful instruments.

Singing at Lucas Primary School

In week 5, Grade 1/2s and Grade 3-6s participated in a singing workshop run by choral directors at Ballarat Voices. The children sang beautifully and learnt about how music can benefit our wellbeing and activate all parts of our brain! Interested students are encouraged to join the Ballarat Voices choir.

All students are involved in regular singing in Performing Arts and are working towards a whole-school song in the Wadawurrung language which will be performed at the final assembly of the term. In addition, a new Lucas Primary School Choir is beginning as a lunchtime club for keen singers in grades 1-6.



Juniors

Preps and Grade 1/2 students have begun the year with movement and music activities designed to connect their whole body with music-making and foster a growing sense of beat.

Our Prep musicians have explored action songs and games. They are developing their awareness of their singing voice and have explored different ways to alter their songs. Prep musicians have been very excited to explore some of our school's percussion instruments and are developing their listening skills to make some exciting vocal and instrumental music together! They are being so respectful to each other as they learn how to work together as a music-making team.

Grade 1/2 musicians began the year singing a colour song and different expressive ways to move with their bodies. They have recently been exploring the school's range of xylophones, learning correct techniques and important skills of making music as a team. Grade 1/2s are developing their rhythm skills and are learning simple melodies to play together on the xylophones.



Seniors

Our senior musicians at Lucas Primary School are developing their skills in beat and rhythm. They have explored body percussion, following a leader, and using words to create complex rhythm patterns. Grade 3-6 musicians have created a drum circle, using our school's new range of djembe drums. They have followed student leaders, explored different tones and rhythms on their drums and improvised together. Many senior students are involved in our lunchtime Instrument Club (for Grades 3-6) where they make music as part of a xylophone, percussion and keyboard ensemble.





Grade 1/2 Learning Term 1



In Reading this week, students have been practising the skills of monitoring and self correcting. Students have been working on ensuring the words they read, look right, sound right and make sense when reading. They have practised reading independently and then with a partner to ensure what they read makes sense to both them and their partner.









In Numeracy this week, students have been learning to measure and compare lengths. Students have used words such as longer and shorter to compare objects around the room. They have enjoyed creating a 'bunny hop' which they have used to practise estimating and accurately finding the length of their bunny hop, using informal objects such as counters, paddle pop sticks, dominoes and paper clips. Students have learnt skills such as starting from zero, lining units up ensuring there are no gaps and using objects of the same size.









This term in Integrated Studies, students have been learning how to be a Super Citizen at school, home and in their community. We have created four Lucas Legends who represent our four school values: Ronnie Respect, Rosie Responsibility, Evie Excellence and Gary Growth. Students have learnt more about each school value and improved their ability to demonstrate them towards each other. Each week they will work towards earning a Respect, Responsibility, Excellence and Growth Badge to stick onto their capes. We are looking forward to improving ourselves and each other to be the best super citizens we can be.



In Writing this week, students have been writing narratives about a problem at the beach. We have been using the Lucas planning template to help us plan and organise our ideas. Here are some of our plans.
