

Term 1 PE and Senior Athletics Carnival

Prep - Grade 2

This term in Physical Education our Prep and Grade 1/2 students have been learning the rules and routines of PE with Mr O'Loughlin. They have been learning the fundamental motor skills of the underarm throw and the catch. Students have progressed from catching and throwing bean bags and large soft balls to tennis balls, basketballs, and odd shaped objects. Students have begun to explore the fundamental motor skill of the bounce in the final weeks of this term. With the winter basketball and netball seasons approaching, students were excited to get out the basketballs and netballs to practise.

Prep students have also been developing their fine and gross motor skills with Mr O on Monday as part of Physical Literacy. They have been doing obstacle courses with a focus on coordination and balance. On alternating weeks students have been participating in fine motor skill activities such as cutting, pasting and using tweezers.



Grade 3 - 6

This term in Physical Education our senior students have been learning more complex manipulative skills related to athletics. Students have learned a different running, jumping or throwing skill each week. They have worked with partners and utilised video feedback to analyse what their partner needs to work on. This was especially powerful when learning the complex skills of triple jump and high jump. Students have also been attending extra training sessions at lunchtimes for the relay teams. The races were hotly contested on the day.





Lunchtime Sports Clubs

This term our House Captains have been organising games, activities and athletics practice for younger students. If your child is interested in being involved they just need to listen to the announcements. Most sessions are held on the outside basket-ball court. The Grade 5/6s have also had lunchtime club with Mr O in the gym on Fridays working on basketball skills and athletics skills.



VISUAL ARTS TERM 1

Our Prep students have made a fantastic start to their Art learning. They have been learning about the rules and routines of the art room as they explore the art elements of line, shape and colour. A big focus of our work has been to explore the way lines can make different shapes and patterns. So far, we have made some colourful abstract artworks based on the story book 'The Dot', some shape robots, some colourful line monsters and a painted and printed rainbow. Our Grade 1/2 artists have worked on creating two different artworks this term based on the French artist, 'Henri Rousseau'. Rousseau was known for creating paintings of jungles and jungle animals using simple shapes and bright colours. We used his work as inspiration to create some amazing painted and collaged tigers. The students worked so well on these and this effort is reflected in fantastic finished pieces. We also created some 3-dimensional relief sculptures of Toucans using plaster and cardboard. This was a very complex piece that took several weeks. The final artworks are stunning and were shared by some very proud students at last week's assembly. Look out for them coming home soon.



To complement their learning in Japanese classes, the 3-6s have been learning about Japanese Festivals and architecture and have created several related artworks. They learnt about the Japanese art technique called 'sumi e' which translates as black ink painting. The 3/4s used black ink and acrylic paint to create some cherry blossoms scrolls and the 5/6s used black ink and red paper to paint some striking Japanese pagodas.



In addition, our 3/4s have just completed some fabulous papier mache Kokeshi and samurai dolls and the 5/6s are currently working on creating some fabulous Japanese Koinobori kites by printing with black ink on fabric. Well done to all our 3-6s on an amazing effort this term.
