# **Performing Arts Term 2**



This term in Performing Arts, all students are exploring music related to our planet and the world around us. The whole-school song for this term celebrates the beauty of our planet and will be accompanied by body percussion rhythms from our 5/6s and ukulele playing from some of our grade 3/4s as well as beautiful singing from the whole school! This will be shared in the final assembly of the term.

Our Prep\_musicians and actors have been exploring songs and drama relating to different animals around the world. They have explored story-telling through actions and emotions and have integrated these into their songs. Some of our Prep grades have started collaborating with a Grade 3/4 class for a combined singing and ukulele performance. All Prep classes will get to experience this later in the term!









Grade 3/4/5 musicians are applying their new skills on the ukulele, and using some of the school's newest instruments! They are using their rhythm skills to perform strumming patterns as an ensemble and are learning simple chord progressions. They are already starting to support music projects across the school with their ukuleles, including songs for the Preps and the whole-school song.

Grade 1/2 musicians have been learning songs, chants and percussion pieces relating to Planet Earth and environmentalism. They have created chants based on environmental messages and are exploring ways of turning these into music, focusing on rhythm, repetition and ways to create emphasis. They have been exploring Boomwhackers and will soon be starting on Djembe drums.



Grade 5/6 musicians are exploring music in patterns of 3, known as 3:4 time. They are exploring these beat patterns through movement games, xylophone patterns, and composition. The Grade 5/6 xylophone piece about Planet Earth will be supported by the Lucas Primary School choir and performed later in the term







#### **Lunchtime clubs**

Thank you to the Performing Arts leaders Ivy and Megan for organising a fun lunchtime Boomwhacker activity for Education week!

Dedicated members of our Lucas Primary School Choir (Grades 1 -6) and Instrument clubs (Grades 3-6) meet each week at lunchtimes for some great music-making! These students are exploring music from around the world, and both clubs have an excursion to perform at a local early learning centre later this term.



# SPORT & PE Term 2

#### Prep - Grade 2

This term in Physical Education our junior students have continued to develop their fundamental motor skills. Our main focus this term so far has been kicking. Students have been working on doing powerful kicks and learning the components of the kick. Students have also been learning other soccer-based skills such as dribbling, trapping and goal keeping.

Each week at the conclusion of our skill activities students have also been participating in small-sided soccer matches to put the skills they are learning into context. It has been fantastic to see how much our students have learned this term, especially with lots of small games going at once.







#### **Grade 3 - 6**

This term in Physical Education our senior students have been focusing on learning the tactics and strategies of invasion games. We have been exploring offensive strategies and about how to use the space on the court to your teams' advantage. We are starting to transition from playing basic invasion games to sports which use those strategies, such as netball.



#### **Sovereign Division Soccer**



On Thursday the 1<sup>st</sup> of June, we had 27 students participate in the Sovereign Division Soccer tournament at Wendouree West Soccer Reserve. We initially had two teams with lots of extra players but after another school couldn't make it, our students agreed to split into three teams to help other schools not miss an opportunity to play. This also had the benefit of giving all our students lots of extra game time.

Our boys team finished the day with 3 wins, 1 close loss and a draw against the strongest team in our pool, the Wathaurong Cluster team. Our girls team won 2 out of 3 matches with their 4 goal win against Wathaurong showcasing how well the girls had gelled as a team. Our mixed team, which was thrown together at very short notice, worked very hard and improved significantly throughout the day. They were immensely proud of holding the Black Hill PS team scoreless for the second half of their last match.



When we returned to school we debriefed about the day and the students shared the highlights of the day from their point of view:

- Scoring goals (way more than last year)
- Having fun with friends
- Supporting each other, especially when they missed a chance at a goal
- Supporting all the other Lucas teams when not playing and hearing all the support while playing
- Teamwork and playing to each other's strengths
- Creating lots of chances to score goals
- The boys team getting close to finals and finishing 0-0 with the best team in our pool, the Wathaurong Cluster





Well done to all the students involved. As always, our students represented our school with pride and tried their hardest in all their games. Hearing all the positives from the students, especially from those who have not been involved in lots of organised sport, made the day especially worthwhile.
