Work over the Holiday Period

There was some significant work going on around the school during the holiday period.

Gym Floor: The gym floor has been resurfaced and is looking amazing. This is a task we must complete every 3-4 years. It will be important that students give their feet a good clean before using this space so we keep it in good condition for as long as possible.

Garden Beds: The garden beds throughout Sawyer Street and the Learning Street have been topped up to assist the mulching around tree bases and removing the trip hazards.

Soft Fall: Soft fall mulch has been added to a few of the playgrounds to ensure they remain safe for all who use them.

New Portable: Work has continued on the new portable with rooms being carpeted and the stairs and ramp almost complete. They have also been repairing the ground that was damaged during the install. This included some top dressing, concreting, topping up garden beds and tidying up a new all weather access road from the staff carpark to the basketball court. We are expecting the handover of this building in 2 weeks. We will then be able to use it as we see fit for the remainder of the year. Special thanks to Mark, our groundsperson, who has been very busy during the break.

School Uniform

It was becoming increasingly clear that some of our uniform standards were slipping towards the end of Term 3 so we will be refocusing this term to ensure we maintain our usual high standards The Student Dress Code aims to:

- foster a sense of community and belonging and encourage students to develop pride in their appearance
- support the school's commitment to ensuring that our students feel equal and are dressed safely and appropriately for school activities
- reduce student competition on the basis of clothing
- enhance the profile and identity of the school and its students within the wider community

Generally speaking, there are only a few elements of our school dress code that require greater attention at the moment:

- Shoes all shoes should be black with no identifiable logos. In the past there has been an exemption for runners on P.E days but this is becoming increasingly difficult to manage so we are asking all students to wear black shoes only. There are a range of styles and prices at shops around the Ballarat area.
- Jewellery The only jewellery permitted (for safety reasons) are stud earrings and watches. Please check your child is not wearing necklaces, bracelets, rings, dangling earrings or other piercings to school. We understand that these can be seen as fashion accessories to help forge identity, but they are also dangers to the students as they go about their activities throughout the day, especially those more physical in nature during break times. There is plenty of time to wear these outside of school hours.
- Hats During Term 4 <u>all</u> students must wear their school bucket hats. The school bucket hat has the Lucas Logo and is available from PSW.

Currently our Year 5/6 students are trialling the


Sebastian Foundation's highly regarded online Mental Health Program 'Open Parachute', which supports the
















LUCAS PS - Colour Run 2023
