At Lucas Primary School we will continue to establish a culturally safe environment in which the diverse and unique identities and experiences of our students are respected and valued.


This activity is fabulous for helping the JSC members learn organisational, money handling, communication and cooperation skills.

# **PERFORMING ARTS TERM 4**

This term all of our students are dipping their toes into Drama and transforming into actors, directors and puppet-masters!

Prep, Grade 1 and Grade 2 students have made an enthusiastic and imaginative start on puppetry! They are exploring dramatic play with a focus on using their voices for projection and creating different characters. The puppet-masters are noticing the subtleties in different everyday actions to make their puppets realistic, thoughtful and entertaining. The Grade 1/2 students will also be involved in Process Drama, responding to the emotions and scenarios from the story, 'What do you do with an idea'.

Grade 3, 4, 5 and 6 students have been making connections between drama skills, and skills which help us in everyday life. They are developing their imagination and teamwork skills by creating and accepting offers, including in the much-loved game, the 'Chair challenge' where they invent a reason for their classmate to leave their chair. The actors are focussing on communicating in thoughtful and exaggerated ways through body language. Some students have started working together to create short improvised dramas.

In the next few weeks, students will commence work on preparing a whole-school song for the school Christmas Carols evening. This will involve music or dance composition from each year level, to produce our final Performing Arts performance for the year!

The Instrument Club (Grade 3-6, Thursdays) and Choir (Grade 1-6, Fridays) are busy rehearsing at lunchtimes to prepare for music performances later this term.
