# Year 5/6 in term 1

In Reading, we have been learning about different comprehension strategies to help support and deepen our understanding of the text we have been reading. We have been making connections and inferring the author's purpose.

In Writing, we delved into the world of narratives and expositions. Our students were able to create interesting stories and use persuasive devices and techniques to engage our readers.

In Numeracy, we focused our learning on using efficient strategies to answer questions and problem solve. Our students enjoyed solving open-ended questions and worded problems.

This year, we started a Buddy Program with the Preps. We are so proud of the connections and leadership our 5/6s have shown this term by helping their buddies and participating in a range of activities.



















# **Term 1 PE and Sport at Lucas Primary School**

#### Foundation - Year 2

This term in Physical Education our Foundation and Year 1/2 students have been learning the rules and routines of PE with Mr O'Loughlin and Mrs Cowan. They have been learning the fundamental motor skills of the underarm throw and the catch. Students have progressed from catching and throwing bean bags and large soft balls to tennis balls, basketballs, and odd shaped objects. Students have begun to explore the fundamental motor skill of the bounce in the final weeks of this term. With the winter basketball and netball seasons approaching, students were excited to get out the basketballs and netballs to practise.

#### Year 3 - 6

This term in Physical Education our senior students have been learning more complex manipulative skills related to athletics. Students have learned a different running, jumping or throwing skill each week. Students have worked with partners and utilised video feedback to analyse what their partner needs to work on. This was especially powerful when learning the complex skills of triple jump and high jump. Students had also been attending extra training sessions at lunchtimes for the relay teams.

#### Senior Athletics Carnival

On Thursday the 14<sup>th</sup> of March we had our Senior Athletics Carnival at Llanberris Reserve. Students participated in throwing, jumping and running events throughout the day, trying hard to beat their personal best and earn points for their house.

Congratulations to Bolton house (Green) who will be awarded the Lucas Primary School Senior Athletics Carnival Shield. The shield and the Age Group Champion awards will be presented at our final assembly for the term.


